From the CEO

On Sunday, 11 April, Cyclone Seroja crossed the Mid-West coast near Kalbarri and moved through the northern and eastern parts of the Wheatbelt. Our shire was lucky in that we received some decent rainfall with thankfully not much in the way of damaging winds. The amount of rain received varied within the shire however there was some decent rain hitting some dams. Some farmers have commenced seeding so let's hope we have good rains to follow.

We are still looking for some representatives from the wider Shire community to fill some positions on the Shire of Lake Grace Tourism Advisory Committee which will be a new Committee of Council to replace the Lake Grace Visitors Centre Committee. We are keen to have representation from Lake King or Varley to participate in the Advisory Council as local knowledge of your area is invaluable.

The old Burngup railway dam is undergoing a facelift with the Department of Water funding the desilting of the dam and cleaning up some of the catchment under the watchful eye of the Department of Biodiversity, Culture and Attractions. The dam built in 1926 had about 4 metres of mud. Once full it will prove to be a valuable water source which will be able to be accessed from a tank to be located on the corner of Burngup North Rd and Biddy-Camm Rd. The Department of Water has plans for several other sites within the shire which are being explored.

Budget planning is underway for next year so if anyone has any ideas they want to put forward for consideration now is the time to submit or discuss with a councillor. Community Funding applications are now closed however there is an infrastructure improvement request. You can find the documents on the Shire website.

Works on the Varley cemetery entry upgrade have commenced with works being carried out by Varley Shire gardeners with assistance from community members.

The upgrade will consist of installation of limestone filled gabion basket fence with wagon wheels installed as artwork and a few loads of gravel around the entry.

Recycling Services

Household Waste Collection is a weekly service and collected each Tuesday for Lake Grace, Newdegate, Lake King & Varley.

Recycling is a fortnightly service and alternates between Lake Grace and Newdegate. See below for the upcoming recycling collection dates.

Please Note: There is no kerbside recycling collection service in Lake King or Varley.

The recycling bins are collected by Warren Blackwood Waste and transported to a recycling facility. If items which are not recyclable are found the content can't be recycled and the load will be directed to the landfill.

If an item is covered in food, it is not recyclable. Food is one of the worst contaminators in the recycling process. By using the yellow top recycling bin correctly you are contributing, in a combined community effort, to reduce the amount of rubbish that is directed to landfill facilities each year.
