It has been an action packed few weeks in the Shire with a sheep truck rollover on Kulin-Lake Grace Rd, power outages as a result of widespread thunder storms, and a bushfire at Dragon Rocks Reserve.

Thank you to those farmers and workers that moved quickly to assist with the sheep truck rollover on 11 January. It is distressing euthanizing sick and injured animals at the best of times, let alone so many, as was the case in this incident.

A meeting was held with Main Roads a few days later, and you will find an update about that particular section of road, along with information regarding the storm and bushfire, in this newsletter.

Road Infrastructure

Kulin-Lake Grace Rd, approximately 3km south of North Lake Grace-Karlgarin Road intersection...

An onsite meeting was held on 17 January between Regional and Network Managers of Main Roads, Shire CEO Alan George, and Councillors Steve Hunt and Deb Clarke.

Main Roads confirmed that in addition to the significant repairs in the area during the 22/23 financial year, road widening and shoulder sealing of the bends will be completed this financial year. 0.3 - 0.5 metre strips will be added on both sides.

No timeline was provided, however improved driver warning signage will be installed in the interim. After widening, additional signage, guideposts and edge lines will be installed.

The Shire will continue to monitor the situation with Main Roads.

The severe widespread thunderstorms experienced on Wednesday 17th January caused havoc throughout the wheatbelt resulting in loss of power, phones and internet for thousands of people.

The Shire outside crew were mobilised on Wednesday night to clear fallen trees off not only the local roads, but also the highway as transport trucks started to bank up. The clean-up of local roads continued throughout Thursday, and by Friday all roads were made passable.

I spoke to one farmer north-west of town who had severe damage to his house, sheds, fences and other infrastructure. He said that the storm was frightening but he still managed to get his machinery out and help clear some of the roads. Well done and thank you.

On Thursday the Shire set up a respite centre at the Lakes Village Hall with a generator brought in to keep the fridge running, and provide some cooling for the residents. Vulnerable people were contacted to see if they had any concerns. Thank you to Rosemary Bywaters, and others for assisting with this.

The IGA and Roadhouse had power thanks to generators, keeping the food and fuel flowing for those people who had cash. Telstra being out meant no EFTPOS. If that's not a disincentive to becoming a cashless society, I don't know what is.
