Happy New Year and Thank You!

I have been the Acting Chief Executive Officer since just prior to Christmas and will be continuing in this position for the time being.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of our Shire staff and Councillors for their support during this time and I am very much looking forward to the year ahead.'

Focus Points for the Year:

For the beginning part of this year, our focus will be on:

- The maintenance of water supplies in conjunction with the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation and the Water Corporation
- Completing or commencing several projects that have been included in this year's budget including; footpath lighting at both the Newdegate and Lake Grace Recreation Grounds, repainting of the Lake Grace Swimming Pool (including some refurbishment of the Kid's Pool), progression of the planning stages for the upgrade to the Newdegate Country Club, the purchase of land for much needed industrial purposes in Lake Grace and finally the installation of the much awaited jumping pillow at Lake King to complete the upgrade to the playground
- Maintenance of parks and gardens throughout the Shire.

Our Infrastructure Services Team will be focusing on:

- Ongoing maintenance of the unsealed roads within the Shire
- Re-sheeting of some unsealed roads within the Shire
- · Maintenance on Shire infrastructure

Bush Fires

2019 brought with it some of the worst bushfires the country has ever seen, with nearly every state affected by fires at some stage. In our region alone, we have already seen several fires rip through thousands of hectares of land, which have put our emergency services resources to the test.

So with this in mind, it is important that we are all prepared and ready to act, should a bushfire occur. Bushfires are unpredictable, but having a plan in place may save your life.

The three main questions to consider when putting together your plan are:

- When will you know when to leave?
- Where will you go?
- Which way will go?

The Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) offers a fantastic tool on their website to help you and your family with putting together your own Bush Fire Plan. Whether you chose to leave early or stay and defend in the event of a bush fire, their website offers plans and toolkits that could prove vital in a fire.

It is also important that you familiarise yourself with Bushfire Warning Systems, as these alerts provide information on the severity of bushfires once they have started and reflects the risk to life and property:

Emergency Warning – An out of control fire is approaching very fast. You need to act immediately to survive. If you haven't prepared your home it is too late. You must leave now if it is safe to do so.

Watch and Act – A fire is approaching and is out of control. Put you plan into action. If you plan is to leave, make sure you leave early. Only stay if you are mentally, physically and emotionally prepared to defend your property and you have all the right equipment.

Advice – A fire has started but there is no immediate danger. Stay alert and watch for signs of a fire

Facility Hire

The responsibility of all people, groups, clubs who hire public buildings include:

- ✓ Tables and chairs are to be returned to designated storage area.
- ☑ All rubbish is to be put into outside sulo bins provided, including rubbish in toilets.
- ☑ Ensure all stoves and lights are turned off
- ✓ Any damages incurred while hiring facility will be charged to hirer.
- ☑ Facility to be left in the same condition as found upon arrival include the floors.

All external doors are locked, this is most important. Shire cleaners are responsible for the general cleaning of a facility, however they are not responsible for cleaning up and putting away tables and chairs after a function.

Affiliation fees are set up to help cover some of the costs in maintaining the buildings for the hirer's use which include, but not limited to, general cleaning, water and electricity usage.

If non-recyclable items are found within the contents of a recycling bin, it can't be recycled and the load will be directed to landfill.

If a recyclable item is covered in food, it is no longer considered recyclable. Food is one of the worst contaminators in the recycling process so please remember to rinse out cups, cans, jars etc before throwing them in the recycling bin.

Lakes Women in Farming Enterprises (WIFE)

The Lakes, Women in Farming Enterprises branch hosted the 2019 WIFE Seminar on Tuesday 17 September which was themed Farming Towards Tomorrow.

The seminar held at the Lake Grace Pavilion attracted 120 women and 4 men from all over the WA's cropping region from Dowerin to Esperance.

ABC Journalist and Presenter Di Darmody was MC, keeping everything running smoothly. Speakers included Belinda Lay, who shared her journey on becoming the first farm in Australia to track the movement of sheep using Sigfox Technology (Fitbit's for sheep).

Cyber security expert Dr David Cook was one of the highlights for the day scaring us all into changing our passwords and disconnecting from Bluetooth.

The panellist session was on 'Farming Communities Produce Resourceful Women' included Tania Bray, Natalie Manton, Jordy Medlen and Fiona Palmer.

Rosemary Bartle, Head of Succession with Rabobank taught practical tips how to communicate in family farming businesses and how to successfully run operational and strategic business meetings.

Lake Grace local, Steve Curtin presented on Farming for Profit which included a comparison between 100% croppers' vs mixed farming enterprises.

The final speaker of the day was Kondinin Farmer and CBH Director Natalie Browning. Natalie shared her leadership story and journey to the board room. Finishing the day off with a powerful message on mindset and staying 'above the line'.

The Event engaged with local businesses, local clubs and local organisations using and highlighting their services and products, prior to and throughout the day.

This event was run by the 20 Women in the local WIFE branch. Women in Farming Enterprises (WIFE) Aims to educate, connect and empower rural women who may not have been brought up in the farming community, through the pooling of knowledge between generations, and sharing of resources.

The event was supported by local nonmembers as well as members from around the region. It was a well-run event coordinated by local women for the benefit of the community.
