The priorities given for the project are as follows;

- Ablutions to conform to current standards, including disability access and the inclusion of a shower recess with all associated plumbing and sewer disposal to be upgraded;
- Kitchen to conform with current commercial standards with a desire to increase to the size of the food storage area;
- The floor surface is to be levelled, with particular attention paid to the area adjacent the current bar area.

Other considerations are to refurbish and modernise the building structure, ducted air-conditioning, modernise the office, crèche and bbg area.

Michel has inspected the Country Club and has presented some drawings showing the principal of planning for the group to consider. With this exciting project, the group is looking to present a well-functioning building compliant to current standards, for the long term benefit of the Community.

Lake King Playground

The Shire has been working with members of the Lake King Playgroup Committee to upgrade the Playground area between the hall and sports centre in Lake King.

After assessing a number of quotes, the Playgroup Committee decided Forpark Australia's submission provided the best range and value for money, and they have been appointed as the successful play equipment supplier.

Quotes are now being sought to undertake a number of other works at the site including fencing, paving, shade structures, and limestone retaining walls for soft fall.

Expected completion date has been set for beginning of October. The Playgroup Committee have worked hard to get this project off the ground and once finished it will provide a most welcome and attractive addition for Lake King.

This was a practical multi agency exercise, which involved the evacuation of 'patients' because of a 'fire' at the hospital. Agencies involved were local St John Ambulance, Lake Grace Volunteer Fire and Rescue, WA Police, Lake Grace Hospital and the Shire of Lake Grace.

Coordinating the exercise was the Shire's Community Emergency Services Manager, Mike Barnes and it was adjudicated by officers from the Department of Fire and Emergency Services, St John Ambulance, WA Health Department and Lake Grace Police.

These exercises are important as they are designed to test an organisation's ability to deal with a particular emergency situation, their various procedures and processes, and also contribute towards continuous improvement.

Recycling Services

Recycling bins are collected by Warren Blackwood Waste and transported to a recycling facility.

If non-recyclable items are found within the contents of a recycling bin, it can't be recycled and the load will be directed to landfill.

If a recyclable item is covered in food, it is no longer considered recyclable. Food is one of the worst contaminators in the recycling process so please remember to rinse out cups, cans, jars etc before throwing them in the recycling bin.

By using the yellow top recycling bin correctly you are making a positive contribution to the reduction of rubbish that is directed to landfill facilities each year.

Cat Trap

If you are being kept awake at night by singing or fighting cats, the Shire has a cat trap available for hire.

There is a \$50 bond required prior to handover of the trap which will be refunded to you upon its

return.

Hirer Responsibility When Using Shire Public Buildings

The responsibility of all people, groups, clubs who hire public buildings include:

- Tables and chairs are to be returned to designated storage area;
- All rubbish is to be put into bins provided, including rubbish in toilets;
- · Ensure all stoves and lights are turned off;
- Any damages incurred while hiring facility will be charged to hirer;
- Facility to be left in the same condition as found upon arrival include the floors;
- All external doors are locked, this is most important.

Shire cleaners are responsible for the general cleaning of a facility, however they are not responsible for cleaning up and putting away tables and chairs after a function.

Affiliation fees are set up to help cover some of the costs in maintaining the buildings for the hirer's use which include, but not limited to, general cleaning, water and electricity usage.
