**Privacy Collection Notice**

**Please note that applications to keep more pets in town will ONLY be approved in circumstances where:**

- All pet registration requirements are satisfied;
- The dogs/cats are not used for breeding purposes;
- All dogs are not of a restricted breed or declared a dangerous dog;
- All abutting neighbours have provided written consent or have no substantiated reasons for refusal (your application may not be supported where your neighbours have valid reasons to object to the keeping of more than two dogs or three cats);
- There is no history or current incidents of dog nuisance, wandering or control that is likely to impact on the surrounding community

**Once an application has been received by the Shire, a Ranger and/or Environmental Health Officer will conduct a property assessment to consider the following:**

- Fence height and stability (ensuring that all access points are fitted with an efficient self-closing mechanism and a proper latch that is able to be locked);
- Proximity of neighbours;
- Location and housing arrangements of dogs/cats; and
- Faecal disposal.

**Please note:**

- Approval may be withdrawn if the Shire of Lake Grace receives a complaint regarding the dogs or cats at the address;
- A review of applications may occur at any stage if it is found that you have contravened any of the above conditions and approval may be revoked at any time;
- Approval will not be granted if adequate means do not exist at the property to effectively confine the dogs and/or cats;
- The permit is attached to the property, so if you move to a new property you will be required to apply for a new Multi pet Permit.
