

Things have been quiet here at the CRC since my last report. The shopping day held at the Golf Club last November was a huge triumph with record numbers but apart from that general business has been low key due to harvest, the Christmas period and limited hours throughout January.

Things are starting to pick up a bit now though, we held a great permaculture course yesterday, have now finished the first term of Pilates classes and continue to hold Rhyme Time with playgroup on a monthly basis. Claire has run a series of classes encouraging older Australians to become digitally literate as part of her Connecting Up grant which has been challenging number-wise but was a fantastic initiative. We held an AusChem accreditation which was organised though Landmark and had our annual 'Cuppa with a Coppa' in March which was much more popular this year. Sergeant Taylor's willingness to be bombarded with questions by the Primary School kids and Happy Little Caravan's free coffees on our doorstep to further entice people in were both greatly appreciated and made the morning a great success.

We have also had an increase in room bookings in the last 4 weeks due to clubs and community groups having their AGMs. Master Group booked out the library room and requested catering for 40 people mid-March which would have been a record number of people in the CRC at one time but unfortunately only 9 turned up.

With plenty planned over the coming months we hope that things will only get busier.

6.1 CHIEF BUSHFIRE CONTROL OFFICER

Summary of the Season 2018/19

The season was early this year, especially in the western zone with very little winter-spring rainfall. As low as 120ml total for the year of rainfall was one report I know of.

Although not a lot of growth we still had our fair share of fires which, with not too much fuel around, all volunteers were able to extinguish them quickly. The biggest fire I am aware of was sixty (60) hectares on Kennedy Road, North Lake Grace.

We also had another incident that I would like to highlight with a truck load of chemicals. At times as a volunteer Bush Fire Fighter you may get to a scene prior to the Volunteer Fire & Rescue Service, so I am thinking some sort of basic training might be needed. Probably my only concern is for Fire Control Officers (FCOs) or whoever lives near a main transport route, for example; Dumbleyung – Lake King – Varley – Ravensthorpe Roads.

In this particular case we had 60kg of Phostoxin aboard burning. No HAZMAT signs were visible and a manifest was not kept in the proper place.

It turned out all good and no exposure was recorded. I think we were all keen to get the job done.

Water had already been applied due to not realising the potential hazards but this turned out for the better, as the tablets then ran their course quickly and within a couple of hours the smell had all but disappeared.

Other items on the truck included Roundup, Ester and pet food.

We had a hay shed fire (4,000 bales), which was contained in the shed. We were fortunate with ten (10) days of mild weather. The fire burnt itself out with the shed still standing. Well contained.

We were not deployed to the 90 Mile Tank Fire on our eastern border.

The Year Ahead

This year we will have had some FCO's standing down;

I would like to thank those mentioned above for their time and effort that they have committed over time. With no disrespect to John or Greg, I would like to make special mention of Richard. He has been actively involved for 30 plus years and as a Deputy has done a tremendous job with his troops in the eastern sector of our Shire. He was always available for advice when

Feedback is sought about the seasonal report that has been tabled and we would like to know if this is too much, not enough or if there is anything else that you would like to see in this report. It is intended as a twice a year snap shot, once at the start of the season and again around the end of January/start of February.

Part of the Report is detailed below.

Department of Fire and Emergency Services Upper Great Southern Region Bushfire Season Update April 2019

The 2018/19 bushfire season in the Upper Great Southern Region has been relatively quiet with 32 fewer bushfires reported in the 2018/19 season to date compared to the complete 2017/18 season.

Conditions remain dry particularly to the east with some shires predicting fewer stubble burns this season due to the impact of grazing on dry stubble. As we near the end of this season the availability of water for firefighting remains a concern in some shires.


Autumn thunderstorms delivered isolated rainfall across the region, despite heavy falls in some areas the soil dryness measure (KBDI described on page 5) across the region remains well above the average values for many reporting centres. **Note:** The combination of high soil dryness and strong winds were a significant factor in the May 2018 fires across the South West of WA. Many reporting centres in this region are dryer than the five-year average and for this time in 2018.

This season saw more requests for DFES personnel to work with bushfire brigades at fires, this has been greatly appreciated as we look forward to opportunities to assist when requested. Please note that the DFES Regional Duty Coordinator is available 24/7 on 1800 865 103 to provide assistance in terms of discussing DFES meeting machinery costs, arranging incident weather forecasts and sending DFES personnel to assist.

Bushfire brigade volunteers, Parks and Wildlife Service and DFES personnel have attended a number of fires outside this region including Bremer Bay, Goldfields, Esperance and Balladonia. This assistance has been greatly appreciated by these neighbouring regions – thank you.





Regional Soil Dryness (7 April 2019)








Keetch-Byram Drought Index (KBDI)

- The KBDI scale ranges from zero, where the soil is saturated with water, to 200; the wilting point for vegetation.
- The number represents the amounts of rainfall (in millimetres) to return the soil to saturation.
- The KBDI provides a guide to fire managers of the flammability of organic material on and within the soil surface that can impact their ability to suppress bushfires.
- The significance of the KBDI depends upon fuel type & structure. In areas of heavy forest fuels, it is important to know when rainfall deficits start to affect fuel moisture.
- During periods of severe rainfall deficit, the reduced moisture contents of scrub and tree crowns enables bushfires to crown more readily and can cause normally resilient woody vegetation to die.
- At a KBDI above 100, grasslands may begin to cure and forests, even with light fuel loads, can develop fuel conditions associated with the incidence of crown fires.

6.11 COMMUNITY EMERGENCY SERVICES MANAGER

LOCAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE (LEMC)

Two meetings have been held since the last BFAC meeting with good attendance, and an extra meeting was held for the risk and hazard workshop. This allowed the shire to partake in the State Risk Project, with funding coming from 'All West Australians Reducing Emergencies' (AWARE).

LOCAL GOVERNMENT GRANTS SCHEME (LGGS)

DFES have offered \$39,321 for next year's budget; I have countered this with \$63,335 for the financial year 2019/2020.

Cel-Fi mobile boosters are still not eligible through LGGS funding, this was discussed at the Regional Operational Advisory Committee (ROAC) with a high recommendation for DFES to consider this piece of equipment to be eligible for the LGGS purchasing list. We have also included a request for a thermal imaging camera to be carried by the CESM or Chief Bush Fire Control Officer.

The Lake King new 4.4 Broadacre appliance is still in the build program. The contract for this type of appliance is in the evaluation stage and delivery is scheduled around third quarter of the 2019/2020 financial year.

SATELLITE PHONES

I have two new satellite phones in my office but Telstra have not yet sent the cases or the sim cards, once these have been received, the satellite phones will be put in the Lake King Bush Fire shed. There will be a procedure around the use of these phones and I will email a copy to everyone once this has been signed off. This will give a total of 5 satellite phones in the Shire, with two being fully funded by the Shire of Lake Grace.

GRANTS

AWARE funding has been acquitted; this was used for the State Risk Project, which is now complete.

PERSONAL PROTECTIVE CLOTHING & EQUIPMENT (PPC & PPE)

I have some stock in my office. Helmets - if you require a replacement one please let me know, I now have these in the office.

Please wear your personal protective clothing and equipment at all incidents.

Please check your current issue for serviceability and if anything needs to be replaced, let me know or bring it to me in the office for replacement. If I don't have your size then I will order the correct size for you.

TRAINING

Two bush fire courses have been completed. The next course is an Introduction to Structure Fire Fighting on the 9 May 2019 at Newdegate and June 2019 at Nyabing.

INCIDENTS

There have been six incidents reported to DFES this year. I have emailed several others requesting incident numbers, so these are not yet showing on the Incident Reporting System (IRS). It is important to report any and all fires that you attend at the time of attending to DFES either directly or through me. Communication Centre (ComCen) number is 1800 198 140. This enables early capturing of information to be passed on to other brigades and also records the incident for future reference when applying for the Local Government Grants Scheme, appliances, PPE and Stations.

VEHICLES

All Appliances are working and able to be used. Lake King appliance will be changed out shortly to have a deluge system fitted to their current appliance this will take about 8 weeks.

If any faults occur, please report them to me even if you are able to rectify them yourselves, as this may be occurring on other appliances and may need to have a fleet remedy for all.

AUTOMATIC VEHICLE LOCATOR (AVL)

Don't forget to test these it is for your safety. This process will not take long if you are on station, pull out the vehicle and push the AVL button 4 times in 4 seconds, it will then flash green and red while testing and then go solid green once complete.

RADIOS

Gerard Drew, from Esperance Communications, is about to do another run for de-installations and installs, with change of positions or change of vehicles.

If anyone is having issues, please let me know as soon as possible. This applies if your radio is damaged or gets broken during the season, please report it to me so that I can lodge a service call to get it fixed.

The Restricted Burning Period is almost over and finishes on the 30 April 2019.

6.12 REGIONAL OPERATIONS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Local Government advised to order E Flares so that Bush Fire Brigades can utilise these in emergencies by placing them on signs and cones. Four (4) sets have been ordered and issued to the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer and the three (3) Deputy Chief Bush Fire Control Officers. These are not to be used when travelling to an incident only in a stationary position.

The public are not slowing down during incidents; if this is the case then the whole road can be closed for the safety of fire fighters working on the road verge.

The article below was published by our friends at the Mandurah Mail yesterday about the announcement of the location of the future Bushfire Centre of Excellence.

In a big boost for the Peel region, Premier Mark McGowan announced on Friday morning that a new Australian-first Bushfire Centre of Excellence will be based in the Shire of Murray. The local council beat competition from 13 other locations to house the \$18 million facility, which will be based on Lakes Road in Nambeelup. The design is expected to be finalised in coming months, with the centre to focus on leadership, collaboration and innovation across the sector.

The establishment of the Bushfire Centre of Excellence was identified as a major requirement in the Waroona Bushfire Special Inquiry.

It is expected to enhance bushfire management practices delivered locally to firefighters across Western Australia, with the centre to focus on 'real-life training.'

The Premier was joined on site by Emergency Services Minister Francis Logan, Mandurah MP David Templeman, Murray-Wellington MP Robyn Clarke and Department of Fire and Emergency Services Commissioner Darren Klemm.

What has been happening?

- Online Fleet Catalogue filtering now live refine your search by Fleet Category,

 Functional requirements for the General Rescue Utility and CAPA are progressing
 well, after which they will be confirmed by the PATs. We'll then be ready to go to
 market with requirements that meet end user & operational needs.
 There has been significant progress in our procurement space, with efficiencies in
 the delivery of procurement activities and re-establishment of important supply
 contracts.

 All PAT Chairs are now in place and PAT memberships are almost finalised across all 14 Fleet Project Streams. All in all, we have had very strong interest from end users, having received over 105 nominations.

What is next?

- The first recipients of the new 3.4 Urban Tankers will be conducting Pilot 'New to Service' User Evaluations, which will help us establish an ongoing feedback loop with end users and the important continuous improvement of our Operational Fleet. These evaluations will be rolled out across all fleet following the pilot.
- Freet. Insee evaluations will be rolled our across an ineet following the plots. We will be conducting important 'Project Health Checks' with key stakeholders across DFES, volunteer associations, unions and WALGA to discuss how the project is going, any agas and opportunities and challenges stakeholders are experiencing. The next Project Board meeting will be held on 20th March 2019.

HAZMAT Structural Rescue (HSR) Virtual Walkthrough

End users were thrilled with the opportunity to be part of a virtual interactive walkthrough (via supplier CAD drawings) of the new HSR in February. With representation from VFRS brigades (Kwinana, Gingin, Armadale), the PAT Chair, Health & Safety Services, Fleet & Equipment Services, VFRSAWA and the supplier, it was valuable to bring end users into the design process early, before the build commenced.

End users' suggestions were constructive, offering solutions to improve safety and usability. Recommendations will improve design, future proofing the HSR rescue locker layout to allow stowage of future equipment updates.

Operational Design and Delivery Model – Importance of Decision Gates

A quick summary of the journey: A Concept Design is developed by the PAT, endorsed by the Project Reference Group & then approved by the Project Board. From here the Functional Specifications are developed, socialised with the PAT for validation and then signed off by the Deputy Commissioner Operations. They are then sent out to the market for tender submissions. Each of these check points is also known as a 'Decision Gate'.

Clearing decision gates helps us improve visibility to the business in relation to what the Concept Designs are, before we go to market. It also assists key areas in the business to prepare for the new fleet. Importantly, passing a decision gate gives the project confidence to proceed to the next step in the model, knowing we have organisational acceptance. Not clearing a gate is an early signal that we don't have end user acceptance and then apposibly be a gap. It means we have the opportunity to close that gap when we see it and not risk finding out too late; avoiding building fleet that is not fit for purpose or at excessive cost to the State.

What's next for our priority fleet?

- General Rescue Utility (GRU): Purchasing will happen through a current CUA arrangement via State Fleet, which will enable us to get the GRUs out into the field a lot
- quicker.

 tight Tender: Recommendations have been endorsed by the State Tender Review Committee and the market has been notified.

 Ultra Light Tanker: Still under Tender Evaluation.
- Ultra Light Tanker: Still under Tender Evaluation.

 Light Tanker: Unfortunately no tender responses were accepted. To ensure end user suitability the project will be commencing a review of the concept design, with a view to go back to market with functional requirements that better reflect 'user needs'.
