CEO's Corner

Potential Issues on Farm and Emergency Water Supplies

I have been contacted by the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) to see what concerns we have within the Shire regarding on farm stock watering issues, low emergency supplies and a high need for carting for livestock watering over summer months. Could farmers please contact the Shire office to register your concerns, to enable relevant information to be submitted to DWER.

Review of Part 13 - Towed Agricultural Implements

Agricultural implements are machines without independent means of propulsion that are built to perform agricultural tasks. While not designed for road use, they may require limited road access when being towed to an operating site.

The legislative requirements for the on-road use of towed agricultural implements are found in the Road Traffic (Vehicles) Regulations 2014 ('the Regulations'), in particular Part 13. These provisions generally mirror the contents of the now repealed Road Traffic (Towed Agricultural Implements) Regulations 1995.

In response to matters raised by the agricultural sector, the Minister for Transport has directed the Department of Transport (DoT) to carry out a review of the legislation governing towed agricultural implements. This will provide recommendations to Government regarding how legislation can be modernised to meet the needs of the WA agricultural industry, support road safety and provide fair road network access.

The regulations concern towing combinations and are in addition to other legal requirements. In particular, vehicles that exceed statutory mass and dimension limits will require authorisation before they can be used on the road. Authorisation could include a notice or permit from the Commissioner Main Roads or the Commissioner of Police, or where there are no defined mass and dimension limits for that type of vehicle, an exemption from the CEO Transport.

The regulations govern matters such as lighting, safety equipment, speed restrictions, movement requirements and permits. Interested parties are invited to provide advice about how the current regulations can be improved to better reflect industry practices and agricultural machine standards.

To facilitate the review and public consultation, the Department has developed an electronic pdf survey,

which can be saved to a hand-held device enabling the user to undertake the survey in increments as time permits. The survey can be found using the below link:

80km Restrictions - Gravel Roads

November.

All vehicles greater than 4.5 tonnes are restricted to a maximum speed of 80 km/hr on all gravel roads within the Shire of Lake Grace from 1 November to 31 December 2018 inclusive. This will assist with road safety and road preservation over the harvest period. Please be alert and considerate of other roads users.

Container Deposit Scheme (CDS)

DWER has released draft customer service standards for consultation. They can be found on the following site https://www.der.wa.gov.au/our-work/consultation/513-draft-customer-service-standards-for-collection-network. This document proposes locations where the community will be able to return eligible beverage containers, of which Lake Grace is one. Once finalised, the CDS customer service standards will inform negotiations between Government and the Preferred Scheme Coordinator on specific criteria, targets and reporting of the Scheme Coordinator, and detail the establishment and implementation of the CDS.

Flooding Event

The contractors are nearing completion of outstanding works, it is anticipated that we will have the works, with the exception of culvert cleaning finished prior to December. The work outstanding is as follows;

- Western Sector Compaction behind culvert headwalls on Duckworth and Fourteen Mile Roads and place rock protection at culverts on Beenong North and Kent Roads.
- Southern Sector Rectification work on Old Ravensthorpe Road, Culverts on Old Ravensthorpe, Nield and Magenta Roads. Sealing of causeway on Magenta Road, this will be undertaken when the Shire's sealing program commences.
- Culvert Cleaning Western Sector is complete, works commencing on the Northern Sector.

Salute to Service Grant Successful!

On Friday 19 October 2018, we received confirmation that our application for the Salute to Service Grant has been successful. This grant will be used for the purchase of four plaques to be placed in each town within the Shire and will honour our service men and women. Thank you to all that were involved in putting this application together.

Unfortunately due to the timing of the Grant being awarded, although we will not have the plaques available for Remembrance Day, they will be installed once they are received.

Prohibited Burning Times

We are officially into bushfire season and prohibited burning time is now in place as of 1 November 2018 until 31 January 2019. **Strictly no burning is allowed**. Please keep safe and be vigilant during the season.

If in Doubt, Leave it out

At the Meeting of Environment Ministers in April 2018, during which there was a strong focus on packaging waste and the impact that China's National Sword initiative is having on recycling in Australia, the Ministers agreed to reduce the amount of waste generated and make it easier for products to be recycled. With this has come some confusion from the public as to what can and can't be placed in recycle bins for kerbside collection. As a result contamination of recycling is still a significant issue, with 15-20% of recycling collected being contaminated. This contaminated material is also effectively being paid for twice – once when it is collected and sorted through the recycling system, then again when it is landfilled.

The following items should NOT be put in your yellow lid recycling bin:

- Materials in bags (any recyclable material should be placed loose in the bin)
- · Plastic bags and light plastic film
- Nappies
- Clothes or other textiles
- Garden and food wastes
- · Gas bottles, batteries or aerosols

- · Ropes, cables and garden hose pipes
- · Shredded paper

You should ensure that all glass bottles/jars, plastic bottles/containers, aluminium/steel cans are empty, clean and that any bottle tops have been removed.

If in doubt, leave it out!

What's Recyclable What's Not!

Acceptable Items



Plastic bottles- without lids, newspaper, cardboard (clean), paper grocery bags, egg cartons, magazines, junk mail, stationery and envelopes, glass bottles and jars, milk & juice cartons, aluminium/tin cans, foil, trays, all plastic food containers, empty aluminium cans

Unacceptable Items



Plastic wrap, plastic bags, coffee cups, fast food wrappers, paper plates, soiled paper, paper towels, napkins, light bulbs, food waste, cups, plates, wine and drinking glasses, batteries, green waste, shredded paper

Specific materials which may have questions about them include 'If in doubt leave it out':

Aerosols – although the instructions on current education materials say that aerosols should be put in the recycling bins empty, many aren't. Aerosols have caused 5 small explosions in the compactor of one of the MRF Operators over the last year. There is also the concern that people are putting all types of aerosol into the recycling bin, including butane canisters which are potentially extremely hazardous. Therefore it is recommended that people do not put their aerosols in the recycling bin, instead they take them to one of the 13 Household Hazardous Waste facilities throughout WA.

Coffee cups – although a similar material to milk cartons, coffee cups are not recyclable through kerbside because of their shape (they would not be sorted by the sorting screen) also these materials would represent a contaminate in the cardboard stream.

UHT Milk containers – if sliver lined, are not recyclable through the kerbside system. These materials are composite packaging. Normal milk cartons which do not have a silver lining are acceptable in the kerbside recycling bin.

Take away food containers – yes if they're clean.

Meat trays – no, currently it is too confusing to know what the material is therefore if it is or is not recyclable.

Tops on or off containers – ensure they are empty, need to be the same type of plastic if going to put them inside the bottle, just end up as contamination if they are in the recycling bin as too small to be collected.

Plastic containers 1 – 7, all are recyclable. What isn't recyclable is flexible plastic or polystyrene.

Shredded paper – should not be in the recycling bin, the shredded paper is too small to be captured and it contaminates the glass stream.
