#### **Flooding Event**

The South West of Western Australia has recently been subject to a significant storm event which has been the cause of damage to assets throughout the region. The Shire of Lake Grace is currently undergoing an assessment of this damage. Your assistance and patience in this process is appreciated.

Shire crews will be driving every road within the Shire over the coming days to determine accessibility and the extent of the damage. Local community input is encouraged to assist in establishing the issues.

We are awaiting any announcements on any financial assistance that may be offered through natural disaster relief and recovery arrangements, to bring our assets back to standard. For this type of claim we need to identify the local road name, SLK section and have digital photos of the damaged road. Given the information we are required to obtain, we cannot just repair any road damage, to do this would likely exclude that road from any external funding. Again, your assistance and patience in this recovery process is appreciated.

The Shire is engaging the WA Contract Ranger Services to assist Dog and Cat Management. The first phase of this engagement will be an education process with the Rangers visiting each household within our townsites, to ensure pet owners are aware of their responsibilities. The Ranger will be commencing next week, after the initial education we will move into a regular monthly service of ranger patrols within our townsites.

All complaints that require Ranger Services are to be directed to the Shire Office. Arrangements will then be made with the attending ranger.

Community briefing forums were held last week in Newdegate, Varley, Lake King and Lake Grace. The forums were held to review the discussion paper and offer the opportunity for issues and concerns to be addressed prior to a submission being made. # Ranger Service for Shire

The Shire of Lake Grace has recently engaged the services of WA Contract Ranger Services Pty Ltd. The Rangers will be shortly commencing door to door compliance checks relating to responsible pet ownership, registration of cats and dogs. The purpose of these compliance checks is to ensure every dog and cat is registered, micro chipped and the owners of the animals adhere to the relevant legislation.

The Rangers will be authorised to exercise and discharge the powers and functions in relation to animal control, this includes issuing infringement notices, orders and carry on legal proceedings under the various Acts and Regulations.

WA Contract Ranger Services can assist pet owners with micro chipping their pets by offering an in home service at a rate of \$55 per animal. Discounts apply for multiple pets and pension discount are also available. Alternatively please contact your local Vet.

The Ranger can be contacted on 0459 678 154 anytime for the booking of micro chipping and general Ranger enquires relating to the above legislation, however all complaints need to be directed in the first instance to the Shire Office.

# **Caltrop in Townsites**

Following the recent rainfall the townsites have experienced an outbreak of caltrop.

#### What You Can Do

You can assist by spraying and/or removing any caltrop on your property or verge, please do not put into your rubbish bin as this will contaminate our waste facility and the neighbouring farm lands.

#### **Disposing of Caltrop Plants**

To dispose of any removed caltrop plants please:

- place them into a marked and sealed plastic bag and keep them until winter when they can be safely burnt or
- take them to the Shire Depot, at Absolon Street Lake Grace, where there is a specially marked caltrop wheelie bin facility located just outside the main depot gate.

EMERGENCY WARNING  Take immediate action to survive – you will be impacted by fire Issued every hour unless the situation changes	When there is immediate danger and the fire will impact your home     There is a threat to lives and homes     The fire will be out of control and moving very fast. This is the highest level of warning     Firefighters will find it difficult to control the fire and it will take significant firefighting resources and a change in conditions to bring it under control     A siren sound called the Standard Emergency Warning Signal	You need to act immediately to survive  If the way is clear leave immediately for your safer place and take your survival kit with you  If you have not prepared your home, it is too late to do it now.
