CEO's Corner

We are quickly approaching the end of financial year with many tasks still to be addressed.

Our road programme has a number of outstanding projects, mainly due to an additional \$700,000 of Roads to Recovery monies being made available by the Commonwealth Government. This is good news for a Shire such as Lake Grace that is dependent on its significant road network.

Staff are currently reviewing the current budget provisions to ensure as many jobs as possible are competed.

This raises the prospect of next year's budget which is now being prepared. If you or your local community organisation have a project for budget consideration, please let us know the details ie cost, local funding options, timelines etc.

#### Lake Grace / Newdegate Medical Practice

Over the past few weeks, Dr Lochner has opened the practice on a Saturday to coincide with local football games, hockey etc. This has proven to be well received by locals. Congratulations to Dr Lochner for his initiative which has helped many who could not normally attend the practice during the week.

#### **Council Meeting Update**

At its 27 April 2016 Ordinary Meeting, Council:

- Approved a planning application for a proposed new single dwelling on Lot 220 (19) Wattle Drive, Lake Grace, subject to conditions;
- Agreed to support the development of a revised Mosquito Management Plan and consider in its 2016/17 budget deliberations the purchase of a new vehicle mounted "fogger";
- Agreed to make an offer to the Executors of the Estate of Mr James Carruthers to finalise the purchase of Lot 1 South Street, Lake Grace which has been a long outstanding transaction for land acquired for the construction of the drainage facility



that has occupied the land for some 40 plus years;

- Authorised unbudgeted expenditure of \$2,847 to finance the purchase and fitting of a "roobar" to the Doctor's Shire provided vehicle;
- Agreed to donate surplus computer tablets HP Elite Pads, to the Lake King Primary School; and,
- Endorsed the appointment of Ms Anne Rintoul as the Newdegate Community Development Association representative to the Shire's Newdegate Rejuvenation Committee.

## Independent Living Units and Lesser Hall – Newdegate

The official opening of the Units and Lesser Hall upgrade was held on Wednesday, 4 May 2016 with Tuck Waldron officiating at the unveiling of the plaque together with Shire President Jeanette De Landgrafft. Local students also participated in cutting ribbons to each of the Units.

The opening was well attended by locals and fellow 4WDL Shires all wishing to see the end result after some months of uncertainty and fluctuating expectations. The Shire's building team and local contractors have done a great job in delivering a quality outcome that received positive comments from those in attendance.

Notwithstanding, there remains some minor final touches to be completed mainly in regard to services such as power and water and other issues raised will be discussed at next week's Newdegate Rejuvenation Committee meeting. The Shire held the official opening of these facilities on Wednesday, 4 May 2016 (See featured story).

#### Independent Living Units (ILU's) – Lake Grace

With completion of the four (4) Newdegate ILU's, this brings to seven (7) the total of such accommodation constructed in the Shire over the past three years. The Shire has laid the sand pad for a further three (3) ILU's to be constructed on Lot 107 Bennett Street, Lake Grace, with construction to start within weeks.

Overall the Shire will have ten ILU's to meet the needs of its "well aged" residents. I have been asked what "well aged" means and it is not as some have mischievously suggested, the very old; but rather "aging and in good health" that can be independent for some years to come.

I would like to extend the Shire's appreciation to the 4WDL Volunteer Organisation of Councils, consisting of Wagin, Williams, West Arthur, Woodanilling and Kent, which together with the Shire of Lake Grace have facilitated some \$15 million of Royalties for Regions investment for forty five (45) independent living units across the seven Shire's. The work of Heidi Cowcher from the Shire of Williams, who has driven the investment applications, finance management and acquittal requirements over these past five years cannot go unmentioned. The Census provides an important snapshot of Australia's people and their housing. It helps estimate Australia's population, which is used to distribute government funds and plan services for your community, including housing, transport, education, industry, hospitals and the environment.

## Wheelie fun family show rolling out across WA

Internationally recognised circus performers will deliver one of the nation's best children circus acts performing in 21 regional Western Australian communities this May and June, including Lake Grace on Tuesday 30 May 2016.

From Paris to New Zealand and China winners of the Best Children's Presentation Award at the 2015 Adelaide Fringe Festival, the Trash Test Dummies will kick off a mammoth regional tour in York, before heading south to Esperance and north to Paraburdoo.

The Trash Test Dummies stars Jamie Bretman, Isaac Salters and Simon Wright are highly skilled circus performers that can trash talk with the best of them. These dexterous dummies take the audience on a journey into their playful imagination inviting us to take a fresh look at the humble household wheelie bin with riotous stunts and an astonishing display of balance, acrobatics, slapstick and juggling.

The *Trash Test Dummies* tour is in huge demand by Western Australian regional communities. It was one of the three most voted shows in Country Arts WA's 2016 Shows on the Go program, a community driven touring program offering regional communities to vote for shows they want to see tour to their town.

The show was in such demand that Country Arts WA was granted additional funding through the State Government's Royalties for Regions Program, the Regional and Remote Touring Fund, to enable Country Arts WA to meet the needs of the 21 venues wanting to present *Trash Test Dummies*.

"This year's Shows on the Go program has been well received throughout regional WA. We have seen more community organisations, local governments, community resource centres and venues wanting to bring high quality performing arts to their town.
