Council, with the assistance of a professional recruitment agency, has recently concluded its efforts to secure a CEO to replace current CEO Neville Hale whose contract ends in August 2016. Council received some 30 applications for the position and, from what was a strong field, interviewed four of those applicants. I am pleased to confirm what many in the community have already heard on the grapevine that Denise Gobbart is the successful applicant. Denise's appointment will be formalised at the 22 June 2016 Ordinary Meeting of Council.

Denise has 30 years of experience with a number of local governments which, with the exception of Port Hedland, have all been in the wheatbelt. Prior to coming to Lake Grace as the Acting Manager Corporate Services, Denise held a similar position with the Shire of Northam (6 years) and Shire of Chittering (4 years). Denise was born and raised in the Mount Marshall Shire, the daughter of an early settler farming family so is familiar with communities such as those found in this Shire and the issues faced by farm and other businesses.

## Tree Planting in our Town-sites

Following a previous call for people interested in revisiting the town landscaping tree planting initiative, a number of interested Lake Grace locals attended a meeting with Shire representatives on Wednesday, 1 June 2016 to provide ideas and suggestions on what could be done in the Lake Grace town-site. Main points of discussion were as follows:

- Need to specify suitable species and prioritise planting areas;
- Identify existing significant trees within the town-site and maintain;
- · An idea to create a tree walk in the town where

- people can walk around using a map and each tree will explain its significance;
- Impact of the new Bush Fire Prone Area requirements
- Weed management education and termite treatment:
- Signage to protect areas of significant remnant vegetation.

Next meeting will be held on Tuesday 21 June 2016 time to be confirmed.

## Ordinary Council Meeting Wednesday 25 May 2016

The Ordinary Council Meeting took place on Wednesday, 25 May 2016 at 3.00 pm at the Newdegate Library Resource Centre. Council received presentations from two community groups, both in regard to recreation facilities, namely:

- Newdegate Active Precinct Committee presented their plans for a skate park and play facility in Newdegate. Estimated cost of the project is between \$150,000 and \$250,000. Area is currently zoned Residential and will need to be changed to Recreation. It is proposed the Skate Park be located on land opposite Pioneer Park. The privately owned land is to be donated to the Shire. A formal proposal will be submitted to Council on 22 June 2016 meeting;
- Lake King Progress Association presented to Council
  about the recent crack repairs to Lake King Netball
  Courts and the effect it has had and community
  expectations for the future. Lake King Progress
  Association is seeking to have the unsafe surface
  repaired. A contractor has been on site to attend to
  their earlier repair works. The Association is now
  investigating the cost of court surface replacement,
  obtaining quotes and will be seeking grants to
  replace the surface of courts. A proposal is to be
  submitted to the Shire for formal consideration.

# The following matters were the subject of Council consideration and resolution:

- Lake Grace RAV access streets to be included in Network 2-4 – Council approved 8 roads in Lake Grace town-site to be added to the Restricted Access Vehicle network subject to conditions and also upgraded some roads to Network 7;
- Outstanding emergency services levy write off for 21 Seward Avenue, Varley and 13 Sugg Road, Lake King – Council endorsed the write off of Emergency Services Levy and Penalty Interest levied on the above properties;
- Unbudgeted expenditure for landscaping and paving at the Lake Grace Sports Pavilion – Council authorised unbudgeted expense of \$3,700 for the completion of the supply and installation of lawn in front of the Sports Pavilion subject to the work being undertaken prior to the 2016 Colts Carnival, or else it would be considered in 2016/2017budget deliberations; and,
- Shire of Lake Grace Cemeteries Amendment Local Law 2016 – Council approved the giving of state-wide public notice of the Shire of Lake Grace Cemeteries Amendment Local Law 2016 in order to seek public comment and to submit to the Minister for Local Government a copy of the proposed law.
