### COVID-19 Case numbers

- As of **20 October 2020**, there have been **738** confirmed cases of COVID-19 notified in Western Australia (WA) and **36 historical cases**. **685** people have recovered.
- To date a total of **466,070** positive and negative COVID-19 tests have been conducted in WA.

### Living with COVID

#### Management of vessels in WA waters

The Department of Health has now successfully managed four vessel outbreaks – Artania, Al Kuwait, Patricia Oldendorff and Vega Dream. The community has remained safe during each of these operations, with no risk to public health. The same processes are being used for the Key Integrity and Al Messilah and will be used for any future vessel outbreaks.

No port in Western Australia is allowing shore-leave for any international maritime crew. This means that no-one can disembark a vessel except for medical treatment, where appropriate safety procedures are put in place. This is an extra layer of border security in place to protect the Western Australian community.

#### Update – Al Messilah vessel

A positive case on the Al Messilah, which is docked in Fremantle, was confirmed on 17 October 2020. This case was disembarked to seek medical treatment for a non-COVID-19 condition and was tested on presentation as a precaution. Further testing on Al Messilah crew revealed a further 24 positive cases.

#### UPDATE - Key Integrity

Nineteen crew on board the bulk carrier Key Integrity, which arrived in Fremantle from Geraldton on 19 October 2020, have been tested. Results have shown a further crew member with a positive result. It brings the number of positive cases from this vessel to two.

#### Phase 5 date postponed

### New exemptions introduced to Phase 4

On the advice of the Chief Health Officer, the WA Government will modify and extend [Phase 4](#) of the COVID-19 roadmap and will allow exemptions to the 2 square metre rule at selected venues that primarily hold seated events, from Saturday, 24 October (or 11.59pm, Friday, 23 October).

### Supporting agricultural industries can secure workers

Based on health advice and under strict conditions, the WA Government will allow WA growers access to [Seasonal Worker Program and Pacific Labour Scheme](#) workers to help WA's agricultural and horticultural industry fill critical labour gaps for this season's harvest.

## Testing

### General population [testing criteria](#)

Any person may be tested if they have any one of the following clinical criteria: fever ( $\geq 37.5^{\circ}\text{C}$ ) OR history of fever (e.g. night sweats, chills), without a known source **OR** an acute respiratory infection (e.g. shortness of breath, cough, sore throat, runny nose) **OR** acute loss of smell or taste.
