COVID-19 Case numbers

- As of **24 November 2020**, there have been **708** confirmed cases of COVID-19 notified in Western Australia (WA) and **38** historical cases. **774** people have recovered.
- To date a total of **539,122** positive and negative COVID-19 tests have been conducted in WA.

Living with COVID

ALL PEOPLE WHO MEET THE TESTING CRITERIA SHOULD BE TESTED

As we ease restrictions, it is essential that Western Australia maintains our high rates of testing. The [Presentation for Testing Direction \(No 9\)](#) were released on 17 November 2020, the [Transport, Freight and Logistics Directions \(No 2\)](#) were released on 13 November 2020, and the [Presentation for Testing \(Quarantine Centre Workers\) Directions \(No 2\)](#) were released on 23 November 2020.

PENDING CHANGES TO COVID SAFETY PLAN AND CONTACT REGISTER REQUIREMENTS

Information will be released to local governments shortly on expected amendments to Covid Safety Plan and contact register requirements under a new Closure and Restriction (Limit the Spread) Direction (No. 8). This will include information on contact registers, Covid Safety Plan compliance and the role of authorised officers.

Frequently asked question

Why can't people be tested for COVID-19 prior to entering WA and be allowed into WA without the need to quarantine if the result is negative?

COVID-19 has an incubation period of 1 to 14 days. This means a person may not show any symptoms for 14 days. If a person is tested during the 14-day incubation period their result may be negative, however they may still be incubating the virus, providing false reassurance they do not have COVID-19.

Face Masks reviewed

The Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) is undertaking a post-market review of all face masks included in the Australian Register of Therapeutic Goods (ARTG). Concerns have been raised about the quality and effectiveness of some face masks, including that they may be included in the ARTG

but do not meet the legislative requirements for medical devices, or may not, or do not, perform as intended.

Enhanced regular testing for hotel quarantine staff

As part of the new weekly mandatory testing program, security personnel and cleaning staff at all State-run quarantine hotels will be tested every 7 days. The new testing program better protects hotel quarantine workers and adds to the protection measures already applied at WA's State-run hotel quarantine system.

Controlled interstate border - update

WA transitioned to a safe and sensible controlled border arrangement on Saturday, 14 November. Interstate travellers are now permitted to enter WA, subject to meeting strict conditions.

On advice from the WA Chief Health Officer, South Australia moved from the 'very low risk' category to a 'medium risk' category on 16 November 2020. This is the highest rating of any other state or territory.

No one will be allowed into WA if they have been in South Australia in the previous 14 days, unless they meet new exemption requirements.

Anyone arriving from South Australia at Perth Airport will now be tested for COVID-19 on arrival (or within 24 hours of arrival at another COVID clinic) and given a Direction to self-quarantine for 14 days in a suitable premise.

- These arrivals will also be required to be tested for COVID-19 on Day 11
- Anyone arriving via road from South Australia will be given a Direction to self-quarantine for 14 days in a suitable premise and be required to take a COVID-19 test on Day 2 and on Day 11
- Anyone who arrived from SA on Saturday 14 and Sunday 15 November 2020, via road or air, will be contacted by WA officials and will be required to be tested for COVID-19 within 48 hours of their arrival and will be directed to self-quarantine for 14 days in a suitable premises.

Testing

General population [testing criteria \(Updated\)](#)

Any person may be tested if they have any one of the following clinical criteria: fever ($\geq 37.5^{\circ}\text{C}$) OR history of fever (e.g. night sweats, chills), without a known source **OR** an acute respiratory infection (e.g. shortness of breath, cough, sore throat, runny nose) **OR** acute loss of smell or taste.
