Bush Fire Service Awards

On Thursday, 6 June, an awards presentation was held at Newdegate Country Club to recognise the contribution of local volunteer firefighters throughout Bush Fire Brigades across the Shire of Lake Grace. The event was hosted by the Shire of Lake Grace and included an opening address by Shire President Len Armstrong. This was proceeded by a joint award presentation led by Shire Chief Executive Officer Alan George, and Department of Fire and Emergency Service (DFES) Superintendent Craig Smith.

The DFES Bush Fire Service (BFS) awards presented included medallions for five years services; and medals for 10 years' service, as well as medal clasps issued for every five-year period served up to 45 years. This marks a tremendous and sustained service to the local community by all 28 award recipients.

In addition to BFS awards, a National Medal was presented to firefighters who have completed 15 years' service, as well as clasps for each additional 10 years.

Issued by the Governor-General, the National Medal, as a Commonwealth Government award, is uniquely distinct as it specifically recognises diligent long service in organisations that protect life and property. This acknowledges that recipients have volunteered service to the community, often at risk to their own wellbeing.

The Shire takes this opportunity to thank all award recipients for their exceptional, and ongoing service to the community.
