From the Chief Executive Officer

Several things have come to my attention in the last week or so that need addressing. First off is people parking on footpaths in Lake Grace. The name should give it away, they are FOOTPATHS not CAR Paths.

In addition to this the vehicles can damage the paths thus creating another unnecessary cost for the ratepayers. Please have consideration for others.

Second, wandering dogs, and I believe even a wandering chicken, in Lake Grace and Newdegate. Not all people are animal lovers and not all people enjoy picking up the mess after dogs have left their visiting card in their garden. The Shire Ranger visits on a regular basis and he is not shy in coming forward, so please don't let your dogs wander.

The All-Abilities Playground in Lake Grace has been a huge hit during the school holidays with dozens of people from all over the countryside enjoying the facilities. I hope they are taking advantage of the other services that the town has to offer.

Negotiations are well underway for a new Deputy Chief Executive Officer. A preferred candidate has been selected and we should know the outcome very soon. Several gravel sheeting jobs have been awarded and our graders are out and about trying to get our gravel roads attended to before harvest. With over 2,000kms of gravel roads to attend to we are trying to do our best.

With gravel supplies being harder to get it does make the job harder and stretches the Shire budget to, in many cases, travel large distances to access resources.

Highlights from Council

25 September Council Meeting

- Several requests have come through in the past few months showing interest in purchasing the old Pingaring School site. This and the neighbouring sports facilities are reserves vested to the Shire from the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage who have the ultimate say. Before Council can fully consider any relinquishment of the Management Order over the reserves, we are seeking consultation with the public. A brief questionnaire is on our website and adjoining shire websites with hardcopies also available. Please contact the Shire if you have any queries. The comment period closes on 25 October. The results of the consultation will determine if Council progresses this matter with DPLH or not.
- Council approved the request for discounted hall hire fees for the Lake Grace Reconnect Group who are hosting the Boots and Ballgowns event in aid of mental health awareness.
- Council supported the WALGA position on the Local Government advocacy positions surrounding council elections.

- Council accepted the offer from the Department of Commerce for extended trading hours for the Shire of Lake Grace over the 2024 / 2025 Christmas period, and Public Holidays in 2025
- The Draft Shire of Lake Grace Disability and Inclusion Plan 2024-2025 was presented to Council and will be put out for public consultation closing 31 October.
- The annual review of the Practice Support Payment to Livingston Medical resulted in an increase in payment of 3% (\$7,500 pa)


