Youth focus driving community collaboration

The Shire's Youth Services has undergone a period of expansion, with a number of initiatives and projects established to strengthen relationships between young people and their community, and provide them with the support to identify and act on issues and opportunities they view as important.

Community consultation held in 2023 to guide preparation of the Shire's ten year Strategic Community Plan highlighted the community's desire to see an increase in youth services, events and community engagement throughout the Shire.

A subsequent youth forum, hosted by the Shire of Lake Grace, gave students from Newdegate Primary School and Lake Grace District High School the opportunity to have a say in what those services might look like, both now and in the future.

Some of the priorities identified were increased access to life skills classes and multicultural programs, improved workplace learning options, establishing a youth centre and community garden, more sporting opportunities for 13-16 year olds, and events.

The increased focus on youth and community engagement prompted the Shire to employ an additional staff member in the role of Community Engagement and Events Officer to assist Community Economic Development Officer, Aimee Turnbull, in bringing the Shire and community's aspirations to fruition.

Armed with a wealth of ideas and inspiration from the forum, and recognising the community's existing strengths and assets, the Shire set about engaging with community members, groups, schools and businesses to establish meaningful and sustainable initiatives that benefit our young people, and contribute to a thriving, and connected Shire community.

Youth focus driving community collaboration cont...

The first initiative established was a Youth Mentoring Program in collaboration with the Lake Grace Men's Shed. This weekly program sees Men's Shed members mentor and impart their technical skills and knowledge onto young people, who are shown how to use tools and equipment to complete projects ranging in size and complexity from chopping boards to seedling benches and planter boxes for the upcoming Community Garden. Donations of tools and money from local businesses and community members, along with funding from the Shire, allowed for the purchase of additional safety equipment and building materials.

Another initiative that has fostered strong relationships is the Shire's Youth Advisory Committee (YAC). YAC was formed, after the success of the Youth Forum, to represent the aspirations, views and needs of young people and participate in projects for the benefit of young people in the Shire, and to act as a consultative body on matters arising in Council business, which affect young people.

YAC operates monthly meetings in both Lake Grace and Newdegate, and youth members have been instrumental in planning for the Community Garden, science and art incursions in Newdegate and Lake King, intergenerational events, and circus workshops. It's youth-led focus has also opened up avenues for funding opportunities that have allowed us to successfully host two larger scale Youth Week events.

YAC facilitation is supported by Judy Garlick, Principal of Newdegate Primary School, Amanda Trevenen, Teacher at Lake Grace District High School, Jessie Bielby, Coordinator at Newdegate CRC, and the Shire. It is intended to come under the umbrella of the Lake Grace Development Association (LGDA) as YAC aspirations align closely to those of LGDA which includes the promotion of business, educational, social and cultural development within the Lake Grace community.

Another key project that has been a long time in the making is Financial Literacy workshops for our young people. This was highlighted by youth as a priority very early on, and over the past eighteen months the Shire has been working with Vynka De Vree of Rabo Bank, our local schools and Talk Money to see these happen. Through funding, the Shire has purchased FLY Financially Literate Youth books, which will be distributed to students who participate in upcoming Talk Money and Rabo Bank workshops.



These fantastic workshops and resources will guide youth on topics such as savings, budgeting, employment, tax, investing, superannuation, major purchases and living expenses, renting and buying property.

What's next? The Shire is currently collaborating with Lake Grace District High School to explore topics that were generated at the recent Illuminate the Day workshop held at the Lake Grace Pavilion, in partnership with Corrigin Farm Improvement Group and funded partly by the Future Drought Fund. As part of Year 8, 9 and 10 Project Based Learning we are exploring our community's values, stories, assets, barriers and connections prior to working on opportunities such as career and learning pathways, employment options, 13 - 16 year sporting needs, and town beautification and event projects.
