By now everyone should have received their annual Shire Rate Notices and have noted that there has been no increase this year on Gross Rental Value (GRV) rates as recommended by the Minister of Local Government as a result of the COVID 19 pandemic. There has, however, been a small increase in Unimproved Value (UV) rates as gravel roads still need to be maintained.

You will no doubt have noticed that Sport and Recreation Specified Area Rates (SARS) have again not been raised this year and I would like to provide a bit of background.

SARS appears to have been first initiated around 20 years ago and was imposed on the four locations of Varley, Lake King, Newdegate and Lake Grace and it was applied in full for expenses relating to halls, swimming pools, other recreation and sport, libraries and other culture.

In March 2019, Council engaged Moore Stephens to undertake a strategic rate review and it found that the SARS for Sport and Recreation did not appear to relate to specific projects or services and in their current form were difficult to justify. Subsequently, the SARS for 2019/2020 was removed from the budget and instead, the equivalent rate revenue was raised through the general rate. This resulted in an increase in rates for ratepayers who had not been paying SARS or were paying a low specified area rate.

Legal opinion was then sought as to whether the SARS was compliant with current legislation. The outcome was that, for a SARS to be validly imposed under section 6.37(1) of the Local Government Act 1995, a specified area rate must relate to a 'specific work, service or facility' and the affected ratepayer must have a relevant benefit from, have access to or contribute to the need of the specific work, service or facility, for example, the SARS raised for the Lake Grace sewerage. As this is a specific benefit for the sole use of the residents of Lake Grace town and as such is a legitimate purpose as defined by the Local Government Act 1995. Furthermore, the SARS could not be redefined so as to achieve the exact same purpose but be compliant in future years as it relates to a category of expense rather than 'specific works, services or facilities'.

As a result of further questions from some ratepayers, additional legal opinion was sought in relation to whether there is an alternative to the imposition of the SARS that would achieve the same outcome and comply with the Local Government Act 1995. Council was subsequently advised that, at the present time, there is no alternative rate or charge available that the Shire could validly impose under the Local Government Act to achieve the same outcome as the Recreation and Culture Specified Area Rates.

Council has been advised that as part of the Local Government Act 1995 review, currently being undertaken, the Department of Local Government, Sport and Cultural Industries has considered possible options for reform to rates, fees and charges under the Act. This also included consideration of a possible amendment to the annual rate charges to enable a local government to impose a levy on all ratepayers to fund a particular service, facility or activity that benefits the entire community. If there is a reform to the rates, fees and charges under the Local Government Act 1995 this may provide an alternative mechanism to impose a rate or charge which would achieve the same outcome as the SARS but comply with the Local Government Act 1995.

The result of all this is that at the present time, Recreation and Culture Specified Area Rates cannot legally be imposed. However, this by no means implies that capital expenditure on new projects will not continue. Worthwhile projects will continue to be supported within all areas of the Shire of Lake Grace

What You Can Do:

You can assist by spraying and/or removing any caltrop on your property or verge, please do not put into your rubbish bin as this will contaminate our waste facility and the neighbouring farm lands.

Disposing of Caltrop Plants

To dispose of any removed caltrop plants please:

 place them into a marked and sealed plastic bag and keep them until winter when they can be safely burnt

or

 take them to the Shire Depot at Absolon Street Lake Grace, where there is a specially marked caltrop wheelie bin facility located just outside the main depot gate.

or

 Newdegate: place them in one of the two blue bins specially marked *Caltrop* on Lot 12 May St (vacant block) Newdegate.

Please Note: There is no kerbside recycling collection service in Lake King or Varley.

The recycling bins are collected by Warren Blackwood Waste and transported to a recycling facility. If items which are not recyclable are found the content can't be recycled and the load will be directed to the landfill.

If an item is covered in food, it is not recyclable. Food is one of the worst contaminators in the recycling process.

Facility Hire

Please contact the Shire and rebook the facility, to confirm you have read the COVID Safety Plan before you resume using the facility.

People, groups, clubs who hire public buildings are required to:

- Complete the WA Government Safety Plan
- Register uses of the facility
- · Monitor entry and exits
- Disinfect surfaces, doors handles, table chairs, showers, toilets regularly.

At the end of the event requirements are:

- Return tables and chairs to designated storage area
- Put all rubbish into the outside sulo bins provided, including rubbish in toilets
- Ensure all stoves and lights are turned off
- · Report any damages incurred while hiring facility
- Facility to be left in the same condition as found upon arrival including the floors.

All external doors are closed and locked;

This is most important as often doors are unlocked when cleaners arrive.

Shire cleaners are responsible for the general cleaning of a facility, however they are not responsible for cleaning up and putting away tables and chairs after a function.

Affiliation fees are set up to help cover some of the costs in maintaining the buildings for the hirer's use which include, but are not limited to, general cleaning, water and electricity usage.

Total Fire Ban

Total Fire Ban regulations mean you can harvest or move vehicles across paddocks during a Total Fire Ban (TFB) as long as;

- a Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban has not been put in place by the Shire of Lake Grace.
- you have a firefighting vehicle on site, with a minimum 400 litres of water.

Shire of Lake Grace will be responsible for placing Harvest and Vehicle Movement. This will happen when local weather conditions result in the Grassland Fire Danger Index (GFDI) reaching 32. Very high in the Grassland Fire Danger Rating.
